Community Minded Homework Challenge

Create a concept map about what makes a good citizen. Display it in your classroom. Concepts to be discussed: "A good school member" or "A good citizen."				Create an "I am helping out at home" card. List a number of jobs and carry them out. Have a parent or caregiver vouch for you. Take photos to show the ways you have been helpful.			
Take part in a community based environmental project such as: a beach clean-up; river clean up or earth hour. Document your contribution with photos, an explanation of what you did and why you believe it is important to participate in this particular event.				Be a mini caretaker. For a fortnight be a mini-caretaker and collect rubbish from the playground. Sign up on the mini-caretaker board and fill in a job sheet. Have a duty teacher sign you off. You need to carry out this task at least 2 times each week throughout your chosen term.			
Interview someone who you believe makes a great citizen. Present your interview like you are publishing it for a magazine. Possibly submit it to your class blog.				Cook dinner for the family. Cook a two or three course dinner for your family. Create a menu and set the table to promote atmosphere. Take photos or have your family fill out a "Restaurant Critique." Year 2-3 children could work alongside their parents while Year 4-6 children could create the whole dining experience.			
Join a community group such as: Brownies; Scouts; Sport clubs; Craft group or St. Johns (etc.). Create an information booklet outlining what happens at your club to encourage others to join. *****PARENTAL DISCUSSION REQUIRED*****				Who is your community HERO? How do they contribute to the community? Prepare a talk about who they are, why they are an important to your community and why you admire them. Have visual aids to support your talk.			
Create a board game to show other children how they can be safe at home or school.				Visit your local kindergarten or retirement village. Ask if you can volunteer by reading to, or spending time with, members of that community. Document the visits by creating a scrapbook of evidence displaying how you spent your time.			
Seniors Only: Become a Role Model at Lunchtime. Set an example for the Junior students by acting as a "big brother" or "big sister." Sit with them for the first 15minutes of lunch showing them how to sit down and eat their lunch at school. Approach a Junior teacher to see if they have a student who needs a bit of help in this way. Carry this task out 5 times over a term (or longer if you can).				Raise funds in some way for those in need in the community. Share your journey with your class – you could create a poster or pamphlet on the cause you have chosen to support.			
Research a local community organisation and give a presentation to show what they do to serve the community.				Create a collage or mural from magazines or your own images representing who we are: 'Let's celebrate Ilam School citizenship.'
